CALL FOR ABSTRACTS AND REGISTRATION FOR THE SESSION

The IPC welcomes the submission of abstracts on topics relevant to the IPC and the theme of the session by 21 May 2021. To promote an interlinked approach to its deliberations, the IPC encourages submissions from authors with diverse backgrounds, including but not limited to: the forestry, agriculture, energy and water sectors; civil society, research and academia; the public sector; women and youth groups; and the private sector. Those authors with abstracts selected for oral presentation should expect to provide pre-recorded video presentations to the Session organizers. Those selected for poster presentation should expect to provide their presentations in electronic format. Oral and poster presentations will be in the English language. Technical specifications for presentations will be provided with notification of acceptance.
